PSA606/ Public Safety Report

Sgt Harvey gave the crime report and announced there were two arrest in recent burglaries. Officers will be on Branch Avenue with new handheld radar devices. The report was followed by a brief Q&A session.

Guest Speaker – Kenneth Ellerbe, DC Fire and Emergency Medical Services

Chief Ellerbe gave an overview of the services and the mission of the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department. Chief Ellerbe stated that funding for his department remains the same but the department faces new and existing challenges and the department must find creative ways to provide services within the budget structure. During the summer there will be soft postings of fire and emergency vehicles at area pools and recreation centers. The Department responds to more than 120,000 emergency calls each year and transports more than 80,000 patients to local hospitals.
