#### Treasurer's Report

The associations' balance as of September 5, 2009 is \$16852.02. The Treasurer's report presented by President Williams was approved by the general membership.

#### President's Report

- The board has approved the motion to use PayPal as a method of collecting membership dues. Details will follow on how the HCCA will implement the process.
- Willard Poteat advised the board again on the on the cleanliness of the Marketplace Safeway. The board has recommended placing an article in the newsletter to ask the community participate in a massive letter campaign on the problem. Lionel Humphrey of Councilmember Alexander's office has pledged support from the councilmember's office.
- Phyllis Schellinger, daughter of Frances Garro expressed memories and thoughts of her mother to the group. Mrs. Garro served as the HCCA secretary from 1998-2000. President Williams noted our recognition of Fran's service with a \$100 contribution to the House of Ruth.

The attendee headcount at the September meeting was approximately 45. At today's meeting there were no new members. ### Other Topics/Issues

Lionel Humphrey of Councilmember Alexander office announced that there were 400 tickets available for the September 9<sup>th</sup> Shakesphere play "Taming of the Shrew." There are also tickets available for Nationals Night Out on Sept 25<sup>th</sup>.

Anne Curtsinger spoke on behalf of David Kirkpatrick to report on the success of the National Night Out. There was a good turnout of about 100 persons.

### Streets, Traffic, Transportation Report

Carrie Thornhill represented HCCA at a NCPC hearing on the 11<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge Project. The meeting was also attended by the Capitol Hill Restoration Society. Although there was opposition and a lawsuit by CHRS, the Commission approved the project. We need to remain vigilant on this project and pay attention to issues of air quality and traffic impacts on Pennsylvania Avenue. There will be City Council Hearing on September 17<sup>th</sup> on land transfer issues related to the bridges.

### 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

Carrie Thornhill reported that the Anniversary celebration begins today with the Panel of Presidents and ends with Blessing of the Trees. The Anniversary Luncheon is sold out. There will be over 225 participants and former Mayor Anthony Williams and the DC Poet Laureate are the guest speakers. The anniversary luncheon costs will come in under budget, leaving a net income to the Association's treasury as planned. The menu has been selected with vegetarian meals. Please arrive early to avoid congestion; the celebration will begin promptly.
